2. Revision to the 2020 Speed Survey Update

- Fiscal Impact: None.
- Recommendation: Council adopt Draft Resolution approving the 2020 Speed Survey Update and establishing speed limits on various City streets superseding Resolution No. 2020-063 without rescinding adoption of said Resolution. [Public Works]

4. Conflict of Interest Code - Biennial Review

- Fiscal Impact: None.
- Recommendation: Council adopt Draft Resolution, updating and amending the Conflict of Interest Code for the City of Atascadero. [City Clerk]

5. <u>Consider a Professional Engineering Services Agreement for the San Gabriel Road and San Marcos Road Pavement Rehabilitation Project</u>

- Fiscal Impact: Approving staff recommendations will commit \$95,000 in budgeted Local Transportation Funds and advance commit \$86,100 in Local Transportation Funds that were projected for expenditure on this Project in fiscal year 21/22.
- Recommendations: Council:
 - Authorize the City Manager to execute a professional services agreement for \$149,817 with Wallace Group to provide design engineering and construction plan preparation services for the San Gabriel Road and San Marcos Road Rehabilitation Project (Project No. C2020R05).
 - Authorize the Director of Administrative Services to allocate an advance of \$86,100 of Local Transportation Funds to supplement the FY20/21 budget for the San Gabriel Road and San Marcos Road Rehabilitation Project. [Public Works]

Caller Geoff Auslen requested Item #A-3 be removed from the Consent Calendar for separate discussion and vote.

MOTION: By Council Member Fonzi and seconded by Council Member Newsom to approve Consent Calendar Items #A-1, #A-2, and #A-5. (#A-2: Resolution No. 2020-072) (#A-5: Contract No. 2020-012) Motion passed 5:0 by a roll-call vote.

3. Del Rio Rd Commercial Area Specific Plan Amendment (AMND18-0079)

- Fiscal Impact: Projected reduction of Traffic Impact Fee revenue of approximately 2.8 million. The short-term circulation improvements necessary to mitigate the new traffic projections are projected to cost approximately \$15 million less than the mitigation measures included in the original specific plan.
- Recommendation: Council adopt on second reading, by title only, Draft Ordinance amending the Del Rio Road Commercial Area Specific Plan, to modify the list of allowed land uses, associated project descriptions, and related traffic mitigation measures. [Community Development]

Community Development Director Dunsmore answered questions of the caller and Council.

The Planned Development Overlay 11, a part of the municipal code, for the Oak Ridge Estates residential project requires that Cenegal Road be completed before building permits are issued for Phase 2. Cenegal Road has been completed but it is not open to the public, yet the City has been issuing building permits. The City's argument is that the road does not have to be open to the public to be completed.

I think back to my days as a student in school. I have never heard of a teacher giving an assignment and then saying the assignment has to be completed but it doesn't have to be turned in

I don't think the intent of PD-11 is that Cenegal Road has to be completed but isn't available for use by the public. Hello,

Below is my public comment (word count 477). I would like it to be read into the record please at tonight's city council meeting. Thank you.

First, I want to share gratitude for Mayor Moreno, Chief Haley, City Manager Rickard, and City Councilperson Funk for showing up, having hard conversations with the greater community about institutional racism, and doing something about it tonight.

I speak as a landowner in the City of Atascadero whose deed does in fact include racist exclusionary language and as a volunteer who has been training and partnering with local leaders in diversity and inclusion on our Diversity Council of the Atascadero Chamber of Commerce.

While I agree with the City's wording and 'commitment to denounce racial bias', I must push back at the 'I will never act officiously or permit personal feelings... to influence my decisions.' We as humans are never going to completely get rid of our biases. They are needed for survival. I strongly recommend adding language and commitment for all City officials, not just police force, to understanding and learning about our unconscious and conscious biases. Additionally, that we work toward multicultural awareness and humility as a trauma informed community'.

There is a universal debate around ignoring versus honoring our differences. I think this should be noted somewhere as well. It is minor in detail yet has a great impact on how it is carried out. The term "color blind" is a way to name the tension when we talk about race and ethnicity. Things like "I don't see color" or "It doesn't matter if you are black or white or any other way" are actually not helpful. We must find ways to celebrate our diversity and be inclusive by fostering awareness, not ignorance about our differences. I think the City has been making strides to increase multicultural education, as seen in some events they hold.

I believe there are living landowners that may find this resolution distasteful and may not find it necessary for the City to take action. As noted in the draft, we are dealing with white supremacist activity in our County. Therefore, it is all the more important to publish this draft resolution. For those who will still question the reasoning for this resolution, I think we must acknowledge in writing that while current landowners and officials who govern the city were not a part of founding the colony and its' racial biases in the literal sense, we must ask ourselves as a community "How am I benefitting from institutional and systemic racism? What is the damage that has been done? What can we do to repair from here on out?" Perhaps we can acknowledge that shaming folks in the present is not the intent and rather we want to empower those who are in a position of power as landowners to set the record straight. This is my American Dream.

Thank you for your time and I hope some of these comments may be useful for enhancing the draft resolution.
